## About the Small Commemorative *Prosphora* (Church Bread) Loaves

In some parishes (including ours, here in Terryville) there is the custom of making small *prosphori* (Church bread loaves) available to the faithful, who send them into the altar with a list of names for prayers for the living and the departed. In our parish these loaves are kindly made by our local bakers, fellow parishioners who have mastered this culinary art.

When the priest receives the *prosphora* and the list, he prays for the people indicated and takes a small particle of bread for each name and places it on the *diskos* (the special footed plate on which the Eucharistic Bread is placed during the Divine Liturgy), in the center of which is the cube of bread which will become the Body of Christ during the Divine Liturgy. The *prosphora* is then given back to the person who requested the prayers, and if you look closely at the loaf, you will find that small particles have indeed been taken out.

The origins of this practice go back to the days when the faithful would bring the bread and wine to be used in the Liturgy.

The *prosphora* you receive back, which of course has not been consecrated into the Body of Christ, is part of the "antidoron", not unlike the bread the faithful receive when coming forth to kiss the cross at the end of the Liturgy.

"Antidoron" means "instead of the gift," and in times past only those who did not receive Communion would take it at the end of Liturgy. The *prosphora* you receive is also an "antidoron," and it is appropriate to share it with the person or persons in whose name it was offered, especially if they are home-bound or too ill to come to the Church for the Eucharist. Some people take their *prosphora* home, and eat a little bit of it each morning on weekdays, after morning prayers and before breakfast, to remind them of the gift of the Holy Eucharist and of the persons for whom the loaf was offered.

## A Wonderful Pilgrimage Opportunity!!!

Dear Brothers and Sisters, the Members and Friends of Saints Cyril and Methodius Orthodox Church, Terryville, CT:

Let's make a joyful, hopeful, and prayerful pilgrimage to venerate the relics of the North American saints on Sunday afternoon, June 18!

Here's more information about that opportunity:

The very first Orthodox Christian parish named to commemorate the memory of all the saints of North America is our neighboring parish of All Saints of North America Church, 313 Twin Lakes Rd, Salisbury, CT 06068. That's up in the northwest corner of Connecticut.

Annually, on the Sunday of All Saints of North America, which is always the second Sunday after Pentecost (June 18, this year), that parish hosts Orthodox Christians from our region for a service of prayer and thanksgiving celebrated before the icons and relics of the North American saints that are present in that parish. Fr. John Kreta, pastor of that parish (as well as the Chancellor of our Diocese of New England) tells us that the Salisbury parish now stewards holy relics of ten of the North American saints. This is quite remarkable. I know of no other place where such a gathering exists.

On Sunday, June 18, at 4:00 PM, at All Saints of North America Church, Salisbury, CT, an Akathist Service (a service of praise and thanksgiving) will be celebrated before the icon and relics of the North American saints. That service will be followed by a fellowship reception with refreshments.

It is about an hour's drive up to Salisbury from here in Terryville. The trip for this occasion on June 18 is well worth our time, and the drive up passes through some beautiful countryside. Perhaps, some of us can carpool, and make the trip together.

Holy Saints of North America, pray to God for us!
