# Are you the person? Represent our Parish as a Lay Delegate to the annual Diocesan Assembly and/or to the Orthodox Church in America's triennial Council.

Dear Members of Saints Cyril and Methodius Orthodox Church:

Glory to Jesus Christ!

We have two opportunities, upcoming in October 2024 and then again in July 2025, for a person (or persons) to represent our Parish as a lay delegate. A person can represent us on both occasions, OR one person can represent us in October 2024, and then a second, different person can represent us in July 2025.

**First**, the Year 2024 Diocesan Assembly of the Diocese of New England will take place in Cumberland, Rhode Island, on Friday-Saturday, October 25-26, 2024. Fr. John H. and Deacon Paul N. are scheduled to attend that Assembly in their official capacities. However, we also require a lay delegate to represent our Parish, as we enjoy the privilege of electing and sending a lay delegate to the Assembly.

**Second,** the next triennial All-American Council (AAC) of the Orthodox Church in America (OCA) is scheduled to take place next summer from Monday, July 14 to Friday, July 18, 2025, in Phoenix, Arizona. Our Parish is instructed by The Statute of the Orthodox Church in America to send our Pastor, together with a duly elected Lay Delegate, to represent us at the OCA AAC.

Are you the lay member of our Parish who is ready and able to serve as a lay delegate to one or both of these gatherings? Costs (travel, accommodations, food, etc.) will, of course, be paid by the Parish. If you are interested in serving in one or the other (or, even, both) of these capacities, or need more information about what service as a lay delegate involves, please, contact me (Fr. John H.) Also, you can speak with parishioners Jack K. and Deb W., who have both served our Parish as lay delegates to these gatherings in the past. Deb and Jack can tell you about the experience from a lay person's perspective.

Please be informed, that in order to be elected and then serve as a lay delegate from our Parish, you must be a full, voting member in good standing of our Parish, and be such a member for at least the last 12 consecutive months\* before the start date of the event in question. You must, therefore, be a parishioner who regularly attends Church and regularly participates in the Sacraments of Holy Confession and Holy Communion.

Please, prayerfully consider this opportunity to serve. Thank you.

## September 6 and 7: Myrrh-Streaming Icon to again visit our Area

On Friday and Saturday, September 6 and 7, 2024, the Wonder-working Myrrh-Streaming Icon of the Mother of God ("Kardiotissa") from Saint George Orthodox Church, Taylor, PA, will be visiting St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church, 54 Winter Street, New Britain, CT. The icon last came to our area a few years ago. At that time, many of us made the effort to go and pray before and venerate that holy icon, and to be anointed by the myrrh it exudes, and were deeply edified and moved by that experience.

This icon is known as "Kardiotissa", which means "Tender Heart". The icon has this title because it depicts the Virgin Mary holding the Child Jesus in a tender-hearted fashion. This icon has been streaming "myrrh," which is a sweet-smelling oil, since October 13, 2011. Some members of our parish have been privileged to venerate this icon, and to be anointed with the myrrh that streams from it.

The icon will arrive at Saint Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church in New Britain at 6:00 PM on Friday evening, September 6. At that time a talk about the icon will be given, a prayer service will be served before it, and all present will have the opportunity to be anointed with the myrrh that streams from the icon. Again, on Saturday morning, September 7, beginning at 9:00 AM, the same schedule of events (talk, prayer service, and anointing) will take place.

The Kardiotissa icon has been associated with a number of miraculous occurrences, including the healing of seemingly incurable illnesses, as well as the repentance and conversion of those previously strongly opposed to Christ and His Church.

*IMPORTANT NOTE:* Please note that it is strictly forbidden to take pictures or video of the icon or events associated with the icon. Every effort is made to maintain pious and sober Orthodox Christian decorum in the presence of the icon, and to avoid any tone or atmosphere of the "sensational." Although unusual, myrrh-streaming icons do occur from time to time in the life of the Church. Usually, when such an event happens it is understood to be an occurrence for the interior life of the Church, a consolation for the faithful. As such, we Orthodox tend NOT to share too much with those "outside" when an icon begins to stream myrrh. We do not invite in the public, and especially not the media. Rather, we gather in prayer and gratitude, thanking and praising God for His unending love and care for us.
